

Campus History

1927– 60 students began instruction under the supervision of the Springfield Dominican Sisters.

1958— The cornerstone was laid for the new school.

1964— A very small gymnasium and 2 additional classrooms were added to the new building.

1994— The new gymnasium, music and lecture rooms were built across King St. to connect the original building with the “new” building.

2008— The establishment of Little Saints Preschool was housed at the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish Hall.

2016— Stand-alone Little Saints Preschool Annex is completed on the school campus.

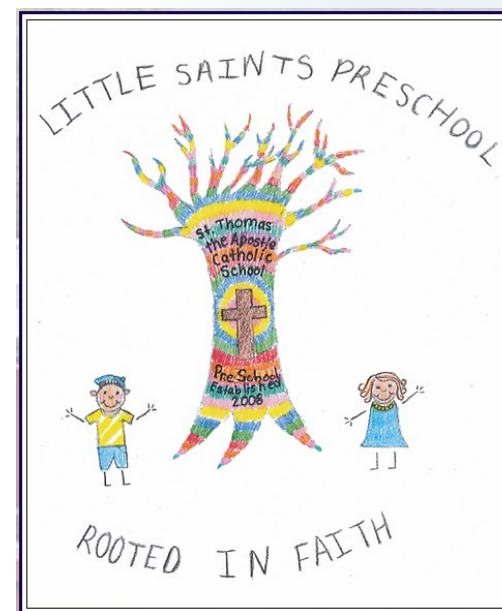
