### SCHOOL SAFETY

We continue to monitor the school security and safety of our children. We check the outside doors routinely throughout the day. When teachers leave the building with their classes, they have either a cell phone or a walkie-talkie with them. The staff and students practice drills routinely for fire, intruder, tornado, and bus evacuation. The Crystal Lake Fire Department observed our fire drill evacuation procedures on Monday and were very impressed with the orderly way the building was evacuated. Today, the Crystal Lake Police Department observed our lockdown procedure for an intruder. We do the state required lockdown, but we are training in ALICE for such critical incidents. In the event of a true intruder, teachers will decide, based on the information given, whether to lockdown or evacuate. We will be informing you as we progress with rolling out the ALICE training which is not just for the staff but also the students and parents.


Yesterday, Fr. Bob, Mrs. Ruffolo and I attended the Illinois School Safety Conference. It provided us with
