UNIFORM UPDATE

Reminder that the most current and accurate description of uniform requirements can be found on the <u>Dennis website</u>.

The Dennis website does not show the school logo on the items. This would require multiple photos for the multiple different schools to which Dennis supplies uniforms.

From November 1 through Spring Break, *all* students should be wearing a uniform fleece or a sweater with the logo. Spirit Wear sweatshirts or plain cardigans are not part of the uniform.

Girls' polo dresses should also have the logo.

Girls and boys in grades 6-7-8 are required to wear a white oxford (dress) shirt under the logoed sweater/fleece. Boys are required to wear navy, plaid, or gold ties. Ties are optional for girls.

Light up shoes are not allowed on uniform days. Uniform shoes are solid black, brown or navy with no logo of any kind unless that logo is the same color as the shoe.

send the Lei along with a picture of it on our Sacred Heart of Jesus statue and our donation.
