Jesus, joy, and jingle bells!

For unto us a child is born. - Isaiah 9:6

Faith + Family Tips:

+ Advent is the 4-week period leading up to Christmas. We burn candles to remind us that we are preparing for Jesus, the light of the world. This month, intentionally light a candle while you read a story together, play a board game, say a prayer, eat dinner together, etc. As you light the candle, remind your family that Jesus is the reason for the Christmas season.

+ Celebrate the Feast of St. Nicholas on December 6th. Have your children leave their shoes outside their bedroom door on the evening of the 5th. It is customary to have parents stuff them with treats: small oranges, chocolate coins, or an ornament for the tree. Share how Santa Claus can be traced back to this saint.

+ The star led the shepherds and wise men to the place where Jesus was born. Take a star and hide it each day for your children to find. On Christmas, hang it over your nativity or at the top of your tree!

Teaching:

Wreaths were a teaching tool in the early Church. The circular shape represents the circle of life from Jesus' birth till death. Pointy holly leaves symbolize the crown of thorns and the berries signify His blood and sacrifice for us. The enduring evergreen branches tell of His victory over death and forever love for us. As you see Christmas wreaths this year, stop for a moment and share this message!

Prayer:

Dear Jesus, this month we remember your birth in a simple stable, to a young mother, on a silent night. You came to teach us what true love is. Help us to live that

Christmas love out loud! Happy Birthday, Jesus!

Best Hot Chocolate Recipe:

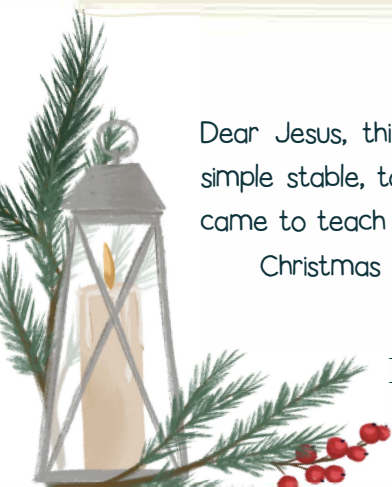
1 1/2 cups sugar
1 1/4 cups cocoa powder
1/2 - 1 1/4 teaspoon salt, to taste
3/4 cup hot water
1 gallon milk
1 tsp vanilla extract
1/4 tsp cinnamon



In a large saucepan, combine sugar, cocoa, and salt. Slowly add in hot water, mixing well. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until mixture boils. Boil and stir for 2 minutes. Add milk, stirring occasionally. Do not boil. Remove from heat and whisk in vanilla and cinnamon.

Make some handmade Christmas cards, pack up the car, fill a thermos with hot chocolate, and head out to bless your family and friends. Encourage your children to ring the doorbell and start singing or humming Christmas carols. Present your loved ones with a card and wish them a Merry Christmas! 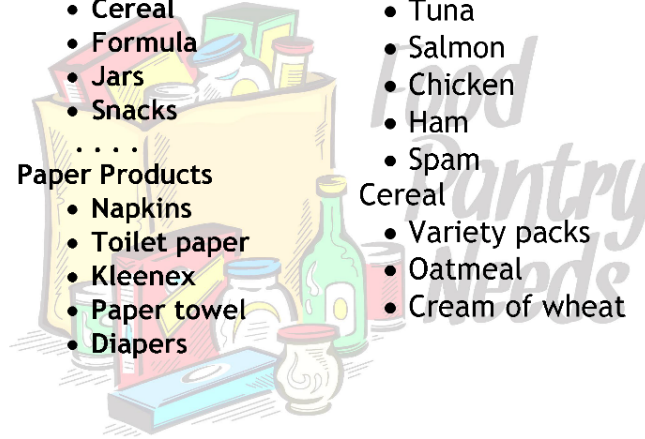
