NURSES' REMINDERS

We are in the midst of cold and flu season. Due to this here are few gentle reminders about our guidelines at STS.

A temperature of 100.0 or more is a sign of illness that may be contagious. We require a student to be fever free <100.0 for 24 hours without fever reducing medications such as Tylenol/ibuprofen to be able to return to school.

If symptoms do not resolve in 48 hours, it is strongly recommended for you to take your child to be seen by a doctor.

If your child will be absent for more than 3 days, a doctor's note is required to return to school.

The presence of sick students in school is detrimental to the health of other students and staff and also not beneficial to the sick child.




MOTHER SON BOWLING

HOPE FOR HAITIANS

During Lent we will once again focus our almsgiving on supporting the work of Hope for Haitians as continue their 18th village. Based in the Rockford diocese, this charity serves the poorest of the poor in Northeast Haiti. Your gifts this Lent will be joined with the gifts from other Catholic faithful in our diocese and be transformed into 40 homes for families, clean water for the entire community. These live changing blessings provide hope and an opportunity for self-sufficiency for the residents of "St Joseph Village" located in Acul-Samedi Haiti.

Goats provide milk, food and baby goats. Many of our villages in Haiti are given goats to offer families a food source and hope for the future.

The cost for a single goat is \$100.

Chickens provide eggs and are a great source of fresh healthy food. Villages and families are given chickens to help supply food for themselves and others.

10 chickens cost \$30.

Cows can provide milk, food and baby calves for families. Many of our villages in Haiti are given cows to help the families become healthy and have a way to earn money.

The cost of a cow is \$600

The families we help live in absolute poverty. Each home Hope for Haitians builds, gives one family a new hope for a better future.




SURVIVING DIVORCE


